### FOREWORD

by Ivan Tarnaj Minister of Agriculture and Forestry of the Croatian Government



In may 1993 the Croatian Government met the representatives of the World Bank, who came to Croatia, to consider the possibilities of assistance the World Bank would be ready to offer for the reconstruction of the war-damaged Croatia. In the discussion I raised the question of assistance to forestry among other branches of national economy. A letter from the World Bank after the said conference raised the question of giving information about Croatian forestry and forest industries with suggestions on topics. The idea of this booklet was born when all those suggestions were considered and elaborated.

In Croatia forestry has a long tradition. There are not many countries in Europe with e.g. a hundred and fifty years old Academy of Forestry, which became later the Faculty of Forestry. Croats are well aware of forestry and its problems, and they respect this most valuable natural renewable resource of their country.

The sad history of Croatia hasn't permitted spreading information about many facts concerning Croatia, forestry included. When this booklet got its final shape, it was decided to print it in a large number of copies and distribute it throughout the world, to inform professionals and other interested in that matter, about Croatian forestry and forest industries. I wish the booklet to fulfill its objective, giving full information about our beloved Croatia, its forests and forest based industries. I appeal all readers to consider it as an attempt to present true information of forestry. If this succeeds, the authors, and myself will be glad, that people will realize that Croatia is a cultural, European nation, with an honourable tradition in many fields, forestry included. We are proud for being Europeans. Europe should be proud for having Croatia in Europe.



### PREFACE

by Joso Vuhelić Deputy Minister for Forestry in the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry of the Croatian Government

The forests are an irreplaceable element of the Croatian landscape, its economy and culture. In their history the Croats were always deeply connected with forests, which gave them the necessary building materials, fuelwood, mast and grazing for their animals, as well as shelter in times of danger.

It is expected that Croatia will develop into a significant tourist land, for which there is much to offer: untouched nature, abundant game, clear streams and clean air. Protection of forests from various diseases and damages remains our primary concern.

A large number of subjects are dealt with in the booklet, and I expect that readers will be induced to visit Croatia in order to get to know its people and its customs but their forests as well.

Numerous people depend on forestry or forest industries in various ways even if they themselves don't actually work in them. But special tribute must be paid to those who do work in forestry and forest industries because they promptly joined the Croatian Army when fatherland was attacked and they defended it valiantly. In short periods of time when the enemy attacks ceased they returned to their jobs, to keep production running, only to go back again to the front line when required. Many of them were wounded or even killed by the enemy mines or bullets. Life and sufferings of these brave people have always been closely connected with Croatian forests - in the past and in the present.

In memory of these heroes, for ideals they were fighting for, we recommend this booklet to the public.
