









## Average roundwood prices in state forest






### Woodprices







### Private forestry – co-operation



## Sales of private forest owners' cooperatives



### Forest development Plan 2011-2020



#### Key problems:

- Socio-economic impact of forest protection
- Availability of wood forest owners' motivation in light of current taxation system and co-operation practice
- Competitiveness limits for truck-transportation

#### Objective:

Sustainable forest management

### Forest development Plan 2011-2020



#### Strategic issues:

- Optimal havest (max 15 mln m3)
- Wood for energy (2 mln m3)
- Forest reserves 10% (208,400ha ->220,000 ha)
- Climate change adaptation maintain annual increment and carbon sequestration
- Forest inventory up-dated information for privat forest owners and decision-makers

# Survey of public attitudes on forestry and forestry related communication



- - 24% (2009:26%) respondents believe that situation in Estonian forests has improved, 33% (35%) believe that it has turned worse in the last 5 years
- Respondants are assuming that big problems are realted with replanting 43% (32%), overutilization 10% (23%) and illegal harvesting 19% (22%)
- At least 2/3 agreed with the following statements:
  - 1. Forest is important for national economy
  - 2. Wood is environment-friendly material and ishould be used more
  - 3. Maintaining forest environment is more important than making income from wood utilization
  - 4. Forest related recreation is growing trend
  - 5. Wood is important source of renewable energy and should be promoted

Respondents "groups": conservative (48%), supporters of wood utilization (28%), balanced (23%)

# Survey of public attitudes on forestry and forestry related communication



- Majority's disagreement with the following statements:
  - 1. Annual harvest is too low high quality wood will rotten and the potential of employment is not used
  - 2. Annual increment is higher than annual harvest
  - 3. Estonian forests are managed sustainably
- People are looking for information on recreation possibilities 62% (51%), forest management 49% (36%) and nature conservation/forest protection 45% (36%).
  Main source of information is internet 91% (83%)
