






Basic information


- Total forest area 2 009 ths. ha 41% of the Slovak territory
- Forest stands are formed from lowland to the upper tree line





Categorisation of the forests according to their prevailing functions

- Commercial forests 69,9%
- Protection forests –17,0%
- Special purpose forests 13,1%
- Tree species composition





- Growing stock 456 mil. m³, per 1 ha 237 m³
- Total current increment per ha 6,14 m³
- Felling volume 9,248 mil. m³, of which incidental felling is 60,4%
 - Conifers 6,183 mil. m³
 - Broadleaves 3,065 mil. m³
- Felling volume out of total current increment cca 75%
- Reforestation area 15 883 ha
 - Artificial regeneration- 9143 ha
 - Natural regeneration 6740 ha






- Cost and revenues are almost in balance it is about 400 mil. € with the gain about 4%
- Forest sector employees- 20 ths.
- The rate of forests sector's contribution to gross domestic product – 0,41%





Development in ownership and organisation

- 2nd part of 20th century all forests under the administration of the state- several state forest enterprises
- After 1990 changes in establishment of society = changes in forestry
- Forests by ownership





Changes in ownership = changes in organisational structure

- •State forests one big enterprise (Forests of the Slovak Republic)
- Municipal forests Association of Municipal Forests
- Church forests the Slovak Union of Diocese Forests
- •Private and community forests the Slovak Union of Republic Associations of Non-state Forest Owners
- •Division in the forest ownership separation of former unique state organisations and state foresters to state and non-state ones
- •Foresters began to search for an independent organisation which could combine them

Slovak Forestry Chamber

- Constituted by the Act 259/1993
- Juridical person
- Non-state, non-political, self-administrated institution
- Associating physical persons and juridical persons as well



- Reasons for creation
 - To take part in the development of Slovak forestry
 - To claim common interests of its members in creating of commercial and social forestry policy
 - To promote and advocate rightful professional, social and economic demands of its members

Present problems

- External
 - Low support from the central body of state administration
 - Restricted competence by law
 - Criticism of non-govermental environtmental organisations (often without proper reason)
 - Weak presentation in the media
- Internal
 - Insufficient interest in the membership from forestry organisations and foresters themselves
 - Shortage of finances

 To advocate the interests of the Slovak forestry with more energy and enthusiasm

 To gain more competences and authority by the amendment of the legal acts

To get satisfactory financial assecuration

To raise the number of members
